

# School Parental Involvement Policy

## **PART 1, GENERAL EXPECTATIONS**

Guyandotte Elementary agrees to implement the following statutory requirements. Guyandotte Elementary shall take the following actions to provide each parent timely notice when their child has been assigned or has been taught for four (4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified within the meaning of the term in section 200.56 of the title I Final Regulations (67 Fed.Reg. 71710, December 2, 2002).

At this time, all teachers at Guyandotte Elementary School are highly qualified, so this condition is not applicable.

8. Guyandotte Elementary shall provide assistance to parents of children served by the school, as appropriate, in understanding topics by undertaking the actions described below—

- the state’s academic content standards.
- the state’s student academic achievement standards,
- the state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments,
- the requirements of Title I Part A.
- how to monitor their child’s progress, and
- how to work with educators.

Encourage attendance of the Cabell County Parent’s Academy and provide parents with guidelines of these actions.

9. Guyandotte Elementary shall provide materials and training to help parents work with their children in the areas of improving student achievement, (including literacy training and using technology) child development, child rearing and additional topics parents may request Weekly insights on healthy childhood will be provided by the principal in the Menugram.

10. Guyandotte Elementary shall, with the assistance of its parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and *coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by:* Community interaction through participation in community-sponsored events such as Civil War Days and dances.
